Jesus is the one and only baptizer of us, for us to recieve the Holy Spirit and fire. Baptizing in the name of the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit affirms the fullness of God in salvation. In practice, many followers of Christ, and denominational Christians today use both by saying something like: "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, in Jesus' name". There is certain conditions to be met to receive the fullest experience of the Holy Spirit. If one has not yet received the full experience with the Holy Spirit or is thirsty then it is biblical to follow through laying of hands for Jesus to baptize you through His witnesses to recieve the Holy Spirit for those not yet received the power and that ask to come, drink and recieve for they are thirsting "out of his belly will flow the rivers" ... "if anyone is thirsty come to me and let him drink". For those of us witnessing for Jesus, laying hands for those coming to Jesus not yet received the power of the Holy Spirit and are thirsty is biblical.
